SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

Receiving the Blessed Sacrament in the Eucharist is the source and summit of our Catholic faith, but during these unprecedented times and to ensure the health and safety of all people, it is not possible to receive the Sacrament publicly during this time. However, there are still opportunities to draw close to Christ and unite with the Church during these difficult times.

While we are unable to receive the Blessed Sacrament during the next several weeks, we encourage all parishioners to take the opportunity to receive the blessings bestowed upon us through a Spiritual Communion. Spiritual Communion is an opportunity to still be able to unite ourselves to the Sacrament. The basic elements of an Act of Spiritual Communion are an Act of Faith; an Act of Love; a desire to receive Christ; and an invitation to Him to come into your heart. Families or individuals can be encouraged to receive Spiritual Communion in the following manner.

STEPS FOR A SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

- Find a quiet space
- Begin with the Sign of the Cross
- Read the daily readings. These can be found at any of the following locations:

- Take time to reflect on the readings
- Pray the Our Father; Pray the Prayer of Spiritual Communion
Conclude with the Sign of the Cross

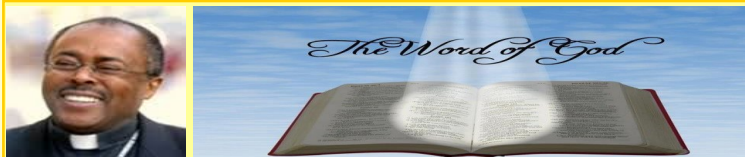
St. Ann Novena currently scheduled for July 18 thru 26

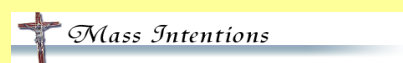
As we are continuing to follow mandates with the suspension of public liturgies, Archbishop late last week announced permission for public Masses to resume on Monday, May 18. To quote the communication, "This decision along with the accompanying policy and guidelines that will be provided to all parishes early next week follows much work and consultation with the archdiocesan Presbyteral (priests) Council, the Missouri bishops and civil authorities. That collaboration will continue through May 18 and beyond, with decisions subject to change based on any new data provided by health officials." Until the directives are received and processed for our following at St. Nicholas, we will continue our suspension of the public liturgies. The mandates will provide information about sanitation, hygiene and personal protective equipment. At least until we are able to move forward, please check your local listings for Masses on the EWTN network on television and <http://www.archstl.org/coronavirus> for local sources.

Unless otherwise advised, St. Nicholas Church will be open today, May 10 and May 17 at 10:30 a.m. for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, individual prayer, devotions and the Sacrament of Reconciliation upon request. Palms that we have are still available for you. Be mindful that the general dispensation from the Sunday Mass obligation will continue for all Catholics of the archdiocese until further notice as many people are still concerned about their health and safety and of those around them. Thank you to those of you who have continued to make financial contributions. We thank God for you too!

Call the office as needed. I will continue to respond as I can and attempt keep us informed. Keep being cautious in your daily life as you stay "prayed-up". Our Lady, Health of the Sick, pray for us.
