SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

Receiving the Blessed Sacrament in the Eucharist is the source and summit of our Catholic faith, but during these unprecedented times and to ensure the health and safety of all people, it is not always possible or desirable to receive the Sacrament publicly during this time. However, there are still opportunities to draw close to Christ and unite with the Church during these difficult times. We encourage all parishioners who would like to do so, to take the opportunity to receive the blessings bestowed upon us through a Spiritual Communion. Spiritual Communion is an opportunity to still be able to unite ourselves to the Sacrament. The basic elements of an Act of Spiritual Communion are an Act of Faith; an Act of Love; a desire to receive Christ; and an invitation to Him to come into your heart. Families or individuals can be encouraged to receive Spiritual Communion in the following manner.

STEPS FOR A SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

- Find a quiet space
- Begin with the Sign of the Cross
- Read the daily readings. These can be found at any of the following locations:

- Take time to reflect on the readings
- Pray the Our Father; Pray the Prayer of Spiritual Communion Conclude with the Sign of the Cross

Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You have already come, and unite myself wholly to You. 

Dear People of God.

Applicable this week is last week's Pastor's Corner's message:

Thank you to the crews who respectively participated in cleaning and sanitizing of the church in preparation for Friday's Stations of the Cross and today's liturgy.

On Tuesday, January 25th the Archdiocese kicked-off the "All Things New: Steadfast in Faith, Forward in Hope" initiative. This is the formation for the Archdiocesan Strategic Plan that I have spoken about. I read a letter at Mass about eight weeks ago from the Archbishop that accompanied that week's bulletin. A video link to the Vicar of Strategic Planning's remarks was sent to those on our email listing. He is Fr. Christopher Martin. On Wednesday, March 2 email information went out about the survey called the Disciple Maker Index. You are encouraged to do an electronic or hard copy completion and submit it by April 4th. If you need a hard copy for lack of access electronically, let me know as we have already distributed such to parishioners. More information will be provided as the process continues.

As part of the process, we were asked to name a primary contact person and 5 key parish leaders all of whom will be working in assisting the progression of this process. Don Elston is our primary contact person. Parishioners agreeing to serve as key leaders are Gene Baldi, Eloise Grimes, Bill McHugh, Jennifer Muzinic, and Jayne Thompson. Thank you, folks for this and your already continual service to the parish.

I will reiterate here as I have for months now, to the extent that you can, everyone is urged to make financial contributions to the church in person at Mass, through on-line giving, or postal mail. Thank you to those of you who are doing so as well as being among those who are regularly attending Mass and are involved in parish ministries. In other words, thank you for your stewardship at this crucial time. Continue to know that aside from being in the midst of numerous structural problems, highlighted some more during these winter weeks, in order to continue operating, there are still bills to be paid on a regular basis.


