We connect today with the spirit of Saint Bridget of Ireland, trusting that God will guide us in her footsteps of holiness and love for the poor.

St. Louis is a target city for human trafficking because of its diverse community that includes many immigrants. St. Louis is a part of a trafficking circuit that linked to Chicago, Indianapolis, Minneapolis-St. Paul, and Kansas City. St. Josephine Bakhita is the patron of ending human trafficking and slavery. She was seized at an early age and sold three times before receiving her freedom. She dedicated her life to giving hope to others who are oppressed. The Caritas Bakhita House in London accommodates and supports victims of human trafficking and is named in her honor.

BEGINNING BLACK HISTORY MONTH: Designed

to coincide with Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass' celebratory birthdays, Carter G. Woodson launched negro History Week in February of 1926 as a coordinated effort to develop lessons and encourage the teaching of Black history across the nation's communities and public schools. Woodson, the son of former slaves became the second black American to earn a Ph.D. from Harvard University. He recognized the importance of establishing an initiative that would be celebrated annually and nationally.
