SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

Receiving the Blessed Sacrament in the Eucharist is the source and summit of our Catholic faith, but during these unprecedented times and to ensure the health and safety of all people, it is not possible to receive the Sacrament publicly during this time. However, there are still opportunities to draw close to Christ and unite with the Church during these difficult times.

While we are unable to receive the Blessed Sacrament during the next several weeks, we encourage all parishioners to take the opportunity to receive the blessings bestowed upon us through a Spiritual Communion. Spiritual Communion is an opportunity to still be able to unite ourselves to the Sacrament. The basic elements of an Act of Spiritual Communion are an Act of Faith; an Act of Love; a desire to receive Christ; and an invitation to Him to come into your heart. Families or individuals can be encouraged to receive Spiritual Communion in the following manner.

STEPS FOR A SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

- Find a quiet space
- Begin with the Sign of the Cross

Pastor's Corner



Dear People of God,

Blessed Pentecost Sunday to you! It has arrived along with the dawning of a resumed Ordinary Time before day's end up to the beginning of Advent. My! Oh, my! Can you feel the presence of the Lord with us, even through the bad news in our country and world that we've come to know since last week's bulletin?

Our plan is to resume the public liturgies at St. Nicholas with more limited seating accommodations according to the archdiocesan directives about readiness for sanitation, hygiene, personal protective equipment and liturgical procedures. We project the new limited accommodations for Mass to be in place by late June. We are about to embark on a relatively new journey by offering live streamed Mass on Facebook and access to their recordings also on You Tube. Tentatively, we will begin that on next Sunday, June 7. Until we are able to accommodate more people according to the mandates, the on-site liturgy presence is limited to the ministers of the Mass including the videographer. However, the Eucharist will be offered following Mass in the Lucas parking lot adjacent to the west wing. We anticipate the distribution to be approximately 11:15 a.m. Please practice social distancing while awaiting reception. We have to do this a few times to get a better sense of the logistics. The intention is to continue the procedure for people even after the church reopens for more in the assembly with those in mind who are unable or encouraged not to attend inside for a while because of age (60 years +) and or a high level of physical vulnerability in light of the pandemic. Please note the Archbishop's dispensation from the obligation for Sunday liturgies still continues for the time being.

Unless otherwise advised, St. Nicholas Church will be open today, May 31 at 10:30 a.m. for the last time in this mode for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, individual prayer, devotions and the Sacrament of Reconciliation upon request.

Thank you to those of you who have continued to make financial contributions.

Call the office as needed. I will respond as I can and attempt to keep us informed. Keep being cautious in your daily life as you stay "prayed-up". Our Lady, Health of the Sick, pray for us.


