

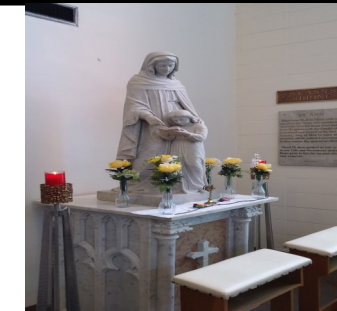

SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

Receiving the Blessed Sacrament in the Eucharist is the source and summit of our Catholic faith, but during these unprecedented times and to ensure the health and safety of all people, it is not always possible or desirable to receive the Sacrament publicly during this time. However, there are still opportunities to draw close to Christ and unite with the Church during these difficult times.

We encourage all parishioners who would like to do so, to take the opportunity to receive the blessings bestowed upon us through a Spiritual Communion. Spiritual Communion is an opportunity to still be able to unite ourselves to the Sacrament. The basic elements of an Act of Spiritual Communion are an Act of Faith; an Act of Love; a desire to receive Christ; and an invitation to Him to come into your heart. Families or individuals can be encouraged to receive Spiritual Communion in the following manner.

STEPS FOR A SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

- Find a quiet space
- Begin with the Sign of the Cross

- Conclude with the Sign of the Cross

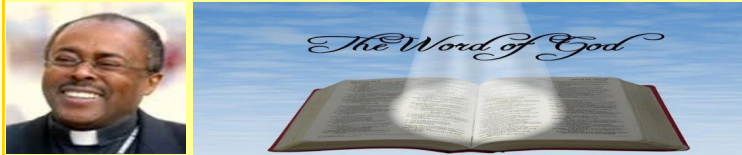
Prayer of Spiritual Communion:

Dear People of God,

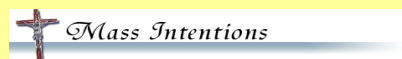
As we still live in uncertain times relative to the recent national and local movement of the pandemic, we will continue to be vigilant for archdiocesan and municipal direction for conducting our public liturgies. As we are currently active, masks are required to be worn by the congregation except for Communion time. For the time being, on Facebook you are invited to search for our page entitled, St. Nicholas Roman Catholic Church, for the live stream Sunday Mass at 10:30 a.m. central time. Some hours later look for the upload on YouTube under the same title, referencing the date of the Mass and also sign on to the front page of our website, <http://www.stnickscatholicchurch.com> Communion will continue to be offered immediately following Mass in the Lucas parking lot adjacent to the west wing. Please practice social distancing while awaiting reception. The intention is for those who are unable or encouraged not to attend inside for a while because of age (60 years +) and or a high level of physical vulnerability in light of the pandemic. Please note that Archbishop Carlson's dispensation from the obligation for Sunday liturgies still continues.

There is a restriction for distribution of hard copy bulletins. Please continue to log on to the parish website for the electronic copy and or let us know your email address for forwarding a copy. If you know a parishioner who does not have such access, let us know the appropriate postal address and we will send a copy from that list.
