Dear People of God,

Continual Blessed Christmas Season to you.

Although not a religious commemoration per se, the 4th day of Kwanzaa coincides with today's worship celebration inspired by the Holy Family. The celebration of Mary, the Holy Mother of God is on Wednesday, January 1. The date will also mark the 7th and final day of Kwanzaa. I note here the 4th and 7th principles for your reflection about how they correlate with our lives as Christians and in particular, our challenges within the parish:

- Ujamaa (cooperative economics)-To build and maintain our own stores, shops, and other businesses and to profit from them together.
- Imani (faith)—To believe with all our heart in our people, our parents, our teachers, our leaders, and the righteousness and victory of our struggle.

Challenges indeed, but we are compelled to continually "co-op" together and regularly proclaim our faith in God, each other, and our individual selves.

I invite you to stop by the Kwanzaa kinara with the printed Nguzo Saba principles by the baptismal fount to remind yourself of these sometimes fleeting virtues which are valuable to maintain and exemplify as we profess our Catholicism within Christianity.


