Pastor's Corner





Dear People of God,

These are pertinent points concerning the recommendations that I spoke of last week. In light of the recent declaration of the virus pandemic, they are now mandated by the Archbishop:

"Here's how we can help protect parishioners from the spread of illness when they gather for Mass:

 \cdot Sanitize all sacred vessels before and after all Masses (with soap and hot water), because germs may survive on surfaces up to 24 or more hours.

 \cdot Suspending the exchange of the sign of peace (or instructing that it be exchanged without physical contact).

 \cdot Advise parishioners to keep a distance of three feet from the nearest neighbor when possible.

 \cdot Share reminders that Holy Communion is encouraged to be received in the hand.

 \cdot Suspending the distribution of Holy Communion to the faithful via the chalice.

· Holy Water fonts should be drained and left empty at this time.

 \cdot Encourage good hygiene, including alcohol-based hand sanitizer lotion in restrooms and public areas, and proper cough-and-sneeze etiquette. It is especially important for extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion to implement these measures.

 \cdot Remind the elderly—who are among the most vulnerable–that they have the option to participate in the Mass on TV via channels such as EWTN, and to request that Holy Communion be brought to their place of residence.

 \cdot Help identify those who are more at risk (i.e., elderly people living alone, persons with disabilities, children and teens), and check on them;

 \cdot People with a respiratory infection, the flu, a fever or a serious cold should be encouraged to stay home and reassured that they are not bound to attend weekend Mass."

Please give attention to what we are emphasizing. They are intended for our individual and common good.


WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS!
