STARTLED AND TERRIFIED

The disciples are "startled and terrified" when they see the risen Christ and hear his message, "Peace be with you." The women have found the stone rolled away from the tomb. They have heard the message of those clothed in white at



the tomb, "remember how he told you...the Son of Man must be...crucified, and on the third day rise again." Likewise, the disciples on the Road to Emmaus return having encountered the risen Christ in the breaking of the bread. The risen Christ has appeared to Simon. Now Christ is present with them, the source of peace; yet they are startled and terrified. We, too, are startled and terrified when we encounter the risen Christ. No matter how often we experience the grace of "God with us," we do not contain it in our minds and hearts. Although it is trustworthy and transforming, it is overwhelming. The Holy Spirit helps us to stay connected, to remain in the presence of God who is present within us. We will do what Jesus did with the disciples. We will break bread together. The ordinary things which we do understand become the windows through which we pass to embrace the depth of God's love which is somehow always known, something we trust in our being, yet will not be grasped.

We must tell our stories of faith to each other; we run to our neighbors and shout, "we have seen the Christ." Even though our words do not tell the whole story. That's ok. When we pray, when we break open the Word, when we break bread together, we recognize the risen Christ in our midst.

St. Josephine Bakhita, you are with us.

MONTH OF THE EUCHARIST: The month of April is traditionally dedicated to devotion to Jesus in the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. The bishops expressed at Vatican II, "The celebration of the Eucharist is the source and summit of our Christian life and all are encouraged to full, conscience and active participation."

NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS: July 17-21, Indianapolis, Indiana. The National Eucharistic Pilgrimage begins May 17. Four groups of 12 pilgrims will begin processing from the North, South, East and West: Lake Itasca, MN, Brownsville, TX, New Haven, CT and San Francisco, CA, all meeting in Indianapolis at the Congress July 16. The pilgrims from the west will arrive in the St. Louis area July 5. They will be at the Missionaries of Charity on July 6 for Mass, Adoration, and delivery of the Boxes of Mercy to refugees in the St. Louis Archdiocese.

The property has rich Catholic history. St. Bridget of Erin Church was established on the site in 1853. It was also the site of a Catholic school from 1970-2012. "The building provides a viable, turnkey setting in which the Archdiocese of St. Louis will deliver state of the art, quality Catholic education in a renovated space that has a long legacy," said the Archdiocese.

BOXES OF MERCY is a service initiative of the National Eucharistic Revival. The Pilgrims arriving in St. Louis from the West Coast will deliver these Boxes, filled with non-perishable items, to refugees in the St. Louis areas. We at St. Josephine Bakhita are a giving community opening wide our doors and hearts to serving all. The boxes, with a list of non-perishable items suggested, are in the back of church.
