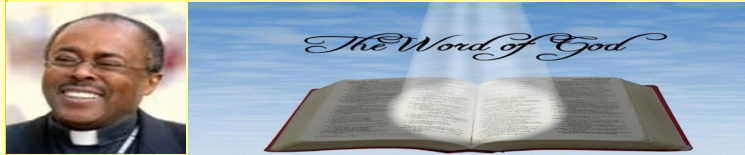

Dear People of God,

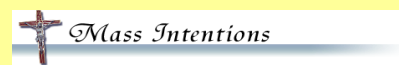
Thank you to our Ladies Sodality who hosted the fundraiser in our Parish Center yesterday and thank you to all who supported the event.
