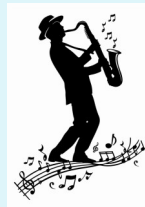

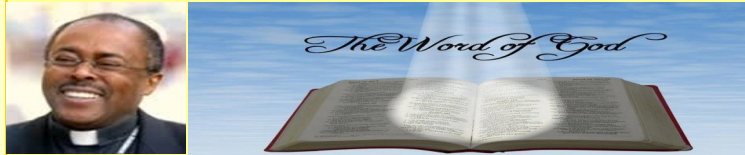

Hear the message of faith in all of our scripture proclamations today and its particular meaning in our collective and individual lives.

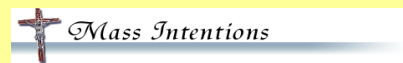
